ON THE OCCASION OF THE MTC BURSARY HAND OVER

27 May 2013 Windhoek Allow me to extend our heartfelt appreciation to MTC for their generous support to another six students. Vision 2030 is about people. It advocates a balanced supply of human resources in response to the demands of the labour market. It is an agony to turn away potential, talent and ambition.
